MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

Economic Scenario

The year 2009-10 proved to be a year of global economic resurgence. The global economy, after faltering due to recession during 2008-09, witnessed an improvement, mainly on account of infusion of stimulus funds by respective countries. China and India led the recovery from the front, on account of huge domestic demand and continued thrust on infrastructure creation, further propelling demand within the core sectors. 1. Significant Accounting Policies

1.1 Accounting Convention

The accounts have been prepared on historical cost convention under accrual method of accounting and under the going concern concept & in accordance with the applicable accounting standards.
